

# A CULTURAL GUIDE THROUGH Prague & Krakow

4-Day Multi City Trip

## DAY 1: PRAGUE

An absolute must-see is Prague Castle, a collection of interconnected palaces built around a cathedral. Take a stroll around St Vitus Cathedral or view the multi coloured cottages on Golden Lane. Don't forget to take a selfie with one of the famous Prague Castle Guards!

Take a stroll over Wenceslas Square, a boulevard with numerous of major events taken place over the city's history. Look past the sausage stands and souvenir shops to enjoy stunning examples of Czech Art Nouveau.

## DAY 2: PRAGUE & TRAVEL

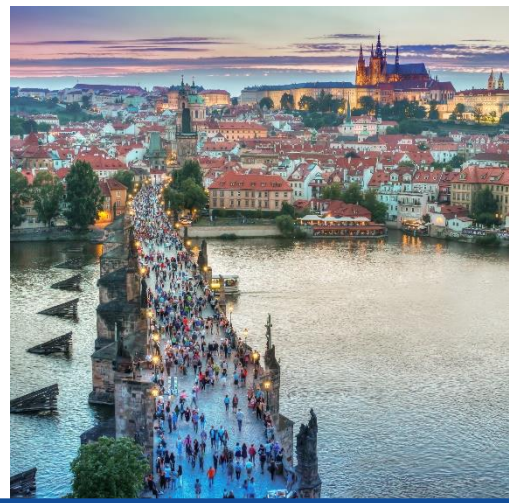
Built in 1357 to replace Prague's original crossing point, the Judita, Charles Bridge is the zenith of legendary king Charles IV's makeover of the city. Today, Prague's Charles Bridge is packed with stalls selling artisanal jewelry and caricaturists offering to immortalize you in ink. The view across the city make the amble across Charles Bridge an unmissable highlight of any Prague trip.

Make your way to Krakow with a direct Eurail train. Hop on the train at Prague Hlavni Nadrazi Station and head straight to the centre of Krakow.

## DAY 3: KRAKOW

Start off with one of Krakow's famous landmarks, the St. Mary's Basilica. Pop in through the Baroque-style entrance to admire the intricately carved altarpiece, colourful wall paintings and gorgeous stained windows.

Admire Italian-inspired architecture, reddish roofs, copper-green towers and a large grassy courtyard at the 16<sup>th</sup>-century Wawel Castle. Visit one of its five separate museums or view Wawel Cathedral brimming with altarpieces and tombstones. Make sure to soak in the gorgeous city views from Sigismund Tower.

## DAY 4: KRAKOW

Take a tour of the Museum of Contemporary Art, a top thing to do in Krakow if you're an art lover. The museum is focused on art from the past two decades and how it relates to the post-war avant garde, the collection contains work from Polish creators alongside internationally renowned artist.

### Museum of Contemporary Art in Krakow MocaK

For some of the best views of the city, head up towards Kościuszko Mound. Surrounded by red brick fortifications, it was financed and built in 1823 by ordinary Polish citizens to honour the 18th century military hero Tadeusz Kościuszko. Now, the site is one of the best places to get a panoramic view of Krakow and the Vistula River.
